# **Alternative Minimum Tax** (a/k/a AMT) the STEALTH Tax!

From our February Luncheon Sponsor, Elizabeth B. Moore, CPA, MTX, Partner, RGO CPAs

Yes, that's right, the "stealth tax." Just when you thought things couldn't get more fun on the Hill, Congress' inability to agree to anything may have even worse unintended consequences than we thought. I am sure everyone has heard of the AMT "patch" by now and may be wondering what the heck they are talking about. A full explanation would take days and pages of text and would probably bore you to tears. So, I thought I would briefly explain it and hope that by the time this article comes out they will have "fixed it!"



The AMT is the excess, if any, of the tentative minimum tax for the year over the regular tax for the year. In arriving at the tentative minimum tax, an individual begins with regular taxable income, modifies it with various adjustments and preferences, and then subtracts an exemption amount (which phases out at higher income levels). The result is alternative minimum taxable income (AMTI), which is subject to an AMT rate of 26% or 28%. What did she say?! Okay, the "long and short of it" is that you take your regular taxable income, then add back some of your itemized deductions (i.e. real estate taxes, state income taxes, unreimbursed employee business expenses, investment advisory fees, etc.) and certain other "preference items" (i.e. gain on exercised stock options, intangible drilling costs, depreciation differences, etc.) and you get AMT taxable income that is higher than regular taxable income. Then, you get a standard exemption to reduce that amount, and then you apply the 26% or 28% rate depending on your income level. The "patches" that have been in place over the years have increased the exemptions and allowed credits that go away effective 1/1/12 (yes, 1/1/12!) That is where the problem lies (well, one of many, but let's stick to the topic at hand.) Because the current exemptions are back at the "pre Bush tax cut" levels, MILLIONS more taxpayers may pay AMT this year than they have in the past.

#### Here is what the Congressional Research Service (CRS) says in that regard:

This problem has long been recognized. In '97, approximately 605,000 taxpayers or about 1% of all taxpayers were subject to the AMT. In 2009, 3.8 million or about 2.7% of all taxpayers were subject to the AMT. Estimates indicate that in 2012 (when the latest AMT patch expires), over 30 million taxpayers will either fall under the AMT or have AMT limits on their tax credits under the regular income tax. If there is no patch for the AMT, then by 2020, 58 million taxpayers will be affected by the AMT.

Phew! That is HUGE! Regardless, I am hoping that by the time you read this that Congress will have "patched it" again and/or better yet FIXED it for good! Cheers to a prosperous and lower taxed New Year!


#### **December Networking Luncheon**




